

DEFINITIONS

- Awning: An architectural projection that provides weather protection, identity or decoration and is wholly supported by the building to which it is attached. An awning is comprised of a lightweight, rigid skeleton structure over which a covering is attached.
- Canopy: An architectural projection that provides weather protection, identity or decoration and is supported by the building to which it is attached and at the outer end by not less than one stanchion. A canopy is comprised of a rigid structure over which a covering is attached.
- Marquee: A permanent roofed structure attached to and supported by the building and that projects into the public right-of-way.

- No signs or advertising in Right of Way.
- Projections shall not encroach within the required width of a sidewalk.
- The projection of any structure or appendage shall be the distance measured horizontally from the lot line to the outermost point of the projection.
- Encroachment across side lot lines and onto adjacent property is not permitted.
- Entrance-type canopies shall not be wider than 12 feet.
- Doors, either when fully opened or when opening, shall not project more than 3 feet beyond the property line or reduce the walkway to less than 3 feet, except that in alleys no projection beyond the property line is permitted.
- Maintain 5 ft minimum walkway for sidewalk pedestrian use.
